I'm Michelle, one of the Trustees on the preschool Committee.

Firstly, a huge thank you to everyone who came along to our recent Stay and Play. We had a fabulous tombola, fairground games, craft and plenty of delicious tea and cake. We raised £272 which was wonderful!



I had the opportunity to visit pre-school recently during session time and I would like to thank the staff for being so welcoming. The team have worked really hard to implement the new curriculum and pedagogy which can be seen throughout the preschool sessions.

I saw evidence of independence and empowerment demonstrated at snack time. Children confidently poured their own drinks from a jug, chatted nicely and tided up after themselves. After any messy activity, children washed and dried their hands independently. The craft area is very well set up for children to access anything they need to be creative.

Positive relationships were clearly demonstrated by staff and there were posters on the wall for children to see to remind them. During the morning I saw children taking turns, helping each other fix a book which was slightly ripped and sharing jugs and cups in the water tray.

It was clear that the staff encouraged children's interests through curiosity and enthusiasm. This was demonstrated with cars and a foam mattress which was made into a road. Lots of questions were asked to keep the children engaged and this enabled the game to be extended. A lot of mathematical discussion also took place which was great to see.

The maths and reading areas are really helping to implement undirected interest in literacy and mathematics. Children are able to choose a variety of books and sit comfortably in the book corner. This was used throughout the morning and it was so great seeing children developing a love of books at such an early age. Maths was seen not only in the maths area but embedded throughout the setting in circle time, play, story time and outside water play.

Pirton Preschool provides wonderful learning opportunities through play. The setting is very clearly set out for children to access any resources they need to play with. Pirton Preschoolers are very lucky to have such a lovely environment in which to learn, lead by a very kind, caring and knowledgeable team.

I had such a lovely morning and can understand why the children love going to Pirton Preschool. Thank-You!
